

Last but not least all the WYPS staff for all of their help and creating the dances for their grades.



Today, September 12th, is national R U OK? Day. It is a day dedicated to reminding everyone to ask the simple, yet important question, "Are you OK?" It is also a day to remind us every day of the year to help support people who may be struggling with the ups and downs of life.

I'm a great believer how significant the "simple" and "little" things are in life. I can remember talking to a group of students recently and one intuitive student asking me, "And how are you going today?" Admittedly, I was taken aback, but it really made my day to know that a young student cared enough to ask the question. I guess the message that is conveyed is that another person cares enough to ask.

If you feel that someone you know or care about isn't behaving as they normally would? Perhaps they seem out of sorts? More agitated or withdrawn? Or they're just not themselves. Trust that gut instinct and act on it. By starting a conversation and commenting on the changes you've noticed, you could help that family member, friend or workmate open up. 
