Thank you to all of our parents in your support of this initiative, who bought tickets, and in particular to a few parents who put in countless hours helping with costumes, etc.



Welcome back to our last term for the year. Day light savings has begun and we are seeing more days of sunshine with the long awaited arrival of Spring.

Who doesn't like a good belly laugh? Mental Health Week begins this week, so I thought I would share some information about the science of laughter and how this simple tool can help support our mental health and wellbeing. The old proverb, "A merry heart does good, like medicine, but a broken spirit dries the bones," reminds us of the difference laughter makes to our lives.

Science shows that people with depression have a higher incidence of having a compromised immune system, whereas people who experience joyful laughter have a positive influence on their immune systems.

When people laugh, the hormone system benefits, because laughter prompts good stress (eustress) and decreases bad stress (distress). The reality of wholeness is that each body process has a biological consequence, whether for better or worse. Just as stress can suppress our immune systems and lead to sickness, laughter can have the opposite effect by improving and optimizing the immune system and blood flow, so we become more "sickness" resistant.

Laughter causes the release of endorphins, our body's natural painkiller, serotonin, our natural anti – depressant; and good neuro – peptides, chemical communicators. It also decreases cortisol, which then reduces stress, lowers blood pressure, increases oxygen intake, enhances the immune system, and reduces the risk of having heart disease or a stroke. Laughter also triggers the production of key neurochemicals such as dopamine, which produces calming, antianxiety benefits, as well as providing us pleasure and reward. It also increases EEG gamma wave frequency in the brain, which synchronizes brain neurons to help improve our memory and cognitive processing and contribute to stress reduction. Laughter has similar benefits as moderate exercise.

The duration of the laugh is not as important as the reason behind it. Having a heartfelt, merry laugh leads to beneficial physiological changes conducive for happiness – happiness being dopamine, serotonin, and endorphins. Happiness is the optimal immune system response.

So get together with your friends/family and laugh as often and as much as you need until you begin to feel good!




