#### **Footy Tipping Champions**



#### Week 7 Positive Psychology!

As part of our student wellbeing program, we embrace the ideas and practices of Positive Psychology. Positive Psychology focuses on the strengths, virtues, beneficial conditions and processes that contribute to wellbeing and thriving.

Positive education also works on the principle that the skills and mindsets that promote positive emotions, positive relationships and character strengths, also promote learning and academic success. Research suggests that there are two significant things that help us develop positive emotions: gratitude and performing acts of kindness.

People who are grateful, who feel and express gratitude on a regular basis, tend to be happier and more resilient. Similarly, performing small acts of kindness for someone each day makes you feel good. When you feel good, you are better at helping and looking after other people, which in turns creates more positive emotion.

Throughout the school, there is a focus on developing the core components of a positive classroom: learning to become mindful by developing an awareness of one's own feelings and those of others, helping children understand and express gratitude towards those who assist and support them, and demonstrating empathy towards others experiencing various challenges.

#### **Sexuality Education**



Growing up and puberty are universal experiences. Children at this age have questions, curiosity and sometimes concerns that relate to their bodies, babies, friends and other relationships. The process of puberty can start as young as eight among some children. The different ages at which children start puberty can make it difficult for children as they observe themselves or their peers changing. All children need to know about puberty before it happens.

Our Sexuality Education program promotes students' social skills, health and wellbeing and runs in close parallel to other programs such as the Life Ed Van program. We will be starting our program with our Grade 5 and Grade 6 students and we see the value in tailoring our program across all the grade levels. Our teaching methods are interactive which allow students to consider their beliefs, thoughts and feelings, enable them to ask questions and engage their families. Our messages about relationships and how changes are common to all people, the biological facts and the chance to discuss concerns with understanding peers and adults is one of our outcomes.

#### **Kinder Transition/Enrolments 2018**

We had a fantastic afternoon with our future Preps. Transition experiences build on the previous school visits and provide a great opportunity to build childrens and parents confidence about future learning. If you know of anyone looking to enrol his or her child please give our Office a call to schedule a tour. Our next transition day will be on Thursday the 19<sup>th</sup> of October 9:00-10:45am.

#### **Head Lice**

I would like to thank parents for letting us know in order for me to distribute the classroom alert notices. When a child has, head lice parents need to notify us as we have processes in place to follow the guidelines under the Vic Health Act.

Please remember if any parents have any questions or need advice about head lice and treatment options please see me. Through our screening process, it appears to be an ongoing issue where some children identified are not being treated effectively. The only way to stop lice from reinfesting is to stop their cycles, so repeat treatment and removal of the eggs is your only option.

#### Lunches!

We have some children complaining that they are starving at break times. If children are hungry, this really influences their concentration, moods and their learning. When the weather is cold, our bodies burn more energy to stay warm so please talk to your kids and adjust their lunchboxes accordingly. My advice is to always send extra food and then parents can monitor hunger levels and have conversations about nutrition.





#### **Second Hand Uniform**

Veronica and I accept and appreciate all second hand uniform donations. All funds raised support our school breakfast program. Your generosity allows all our children to have a healthy start to the day. Keep it coming!
