

Medication

For children who need medication, parents need to bring the medication, before school, to the office and complete the relevant form. All medication must be clearly marked with dosage & name.

Inspiro Dental Program-Term 4

I am looking at booking dates for the Inspiro dental team to come and provide a whole school dental screening next term. This service is open to all children including pre-schoolers. Last year a number of our playgroup families participated, and overall, we had a great result- 94 students. I will send home further information in our next newsletter.

Conjunctivitis Outbreak

This week we've had 6 cases of conjunctivitis in the Grade 1/2 area. Conjunctivitis can be caused by an infection (virus or bacteria) and it's highly contagious. **If your child has conjunctivitis they must remain at home.**

You could develop conjunctivitis if you come into contact with:

- Discharge from the eyes, nose or throat of an infected person through touch, coughing or sneezing.
- Contaminated fingers or objects.
- In summertime, conjunctivitis can be spread when children swim in contaminated water or share contaminated towels.

A person with conjunctivitis will remain infectious as long as there is a discharge from their eye.

Other Symptoms

- Redness behind the eyelid, spreading up the white of the eye.
- Swelling of the eye/s making them appear puffy.
- Excessive tears.
- A discharge from the eye which dries when the child sleeps, causing crusting around the eyelids.
- A dislike of bright lights (photophobia.)

If you are unsure about your child's presentation and symptoms I would encourage parents and carers to get further information from the pharmacist at your local chemist. Also check out the Royal Children's Hospital link at- http://www.rch.org.au/kidsinfo/fact_sheets/Conjunctivitis/

Homework Club every Thursday Gr 3-6

This week will be our final session. I have to say the students who are coming along are getting value out of the sessions. Each week a teacher helps me and I've loved hearing their feedback about when they work with the kids, that they have enjoyed the growth in the students particularly when it comes to reading. Please speak to teachers if you are having any issues and we can work together to improve homework independence.

Labelled Jumpers

Every week there are parents hunting down lost jumpers throughout the school. This is a nuisance when jumpers aren't found and I would like parents to regularly check names. Thanks!

Technology Literacy

Many of our younger children are using technology at home and I would like to encourage parents to be aware of using the privacy settings especially when using social networking sites.

The Internet is a wonderful place for children to learn and have fun, but there are also dangers, and it is important that children are safe while online. Here at Woori Yallock Primary School we are committed to on-going education about safe and responsible online behaviours and this is best imparted in partnership with parents and guardians.



Cooking Room Report!



It's vital that children learn to be safe and responsible for the use of digital technologies including computers, net books, IPAD's, phones, cameras etc. We would like to encourage parents to work with us and reassure this behaviour at home.

When children use the school's internet connection there are several safeguards in place to ensure that inappropriate material is not allowed through, so that the children can enjoy using the internet safely.

The ACMA has a number of education resources for use in schools and at home.

Food Bank Victorian School's Breakfast Program- Breakfast Club Tues & Thurs at 8am

A good breakfast can not only change a child's morning it can make a big difference to their learning and behaviour. Unfortunately 1 in 7 Australian children arrive at school each day without having had breakfast (Australian Bureau of Statistics, 2013). We are lucky to be one of the 500 schools across Victoria that receives breakfast staple foods including oats, wheat bix, canned fruit, UHT milk and baked beans. This program provides us with most of the resources to run our Breakfast Program. Don't forget, Breakfast Club at school on Tuesdays and Thursdays in the cooking room from 8:15am! All are welcome.

Attendance & Absences



Muffin & Milo Grade 6 Graduation Fundraising Drive



This term has flown so quickly! The school is a buzz of activity as we prepare for our final week of term 3 with our school production. While wondering about the school, I have seen staff and students all busy with scene construction and rehearsals. How very special it is that we get to see all students happily participate in the production. It is their time to shine and bring joy and pride to their families as well as staff.

I wanted to share with you the importance of positive affirmations with our children. If your child suffers from negative self talk and self belief, affirmations can be used to override this negative information. They can be used to motivate and help our children achieve success.

One consideration is that they need to be said frequently. The more they are able to repeat them, the more easily they will be absorbed by their subconscious mind. Positive affirmations are more effective if spoken out loud and I regularly suggest that they begin to say them upon waking first thing in the morning and last thing at night.

Here are a few suggestions to get your child started:

- I believe in me.
- I am special; there is no one else like me.
- Mistakes are OK, they help me learn.
- I choose to make today a great day.
- The truth is important to me.
- I am proud to be different.
- If I think I can, I can.
- I have great ideas

Next time you catch your child putting themselves down, encourage them to change their view and counter the negative with a positive affirmation.



